The Barn Museum is a bridge between the Mountain and the House, telling a story of sustainability that has been nurtured by the Smiley family for more than 140 years. The exhibits feature the historic interconnection of people and nature at Mohonk Mountain House by showcasing rare and unusual objects in galleries on the lower and upper levels.

Among Mohonk's unique treasures is its historic Barn Museum. The Mohonk Barn Museum sits next to the Mohonk Stables in an impressive, pale yellow structure, built in 1888, which is one of the largest barns in the northeastern United States. A visit to the Barn Museum offers guests a glimpse into more than a century of life and enterprise at Mohonk Mountain House.

Mohonk's Barn Museum houses extensive exhibits of antiques—all once used at Mohonk. Many items date from Mohonk's earliest years and are still in working order, testimony to the ingenuity and fine craftsmanship of an earlier era.



The Barn Museum also features craft demonstrations illustrating the use of old techniques, including rustic carpentry, blacksmithing, and restoration of carriages and farm machinery. Hours and tours are posted on the Mountain House bulletin board.
